This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving results in the Upper 2 Bands (U2B) for NAPLAN Writing in Year 3 to 40% and Year 5 to 20%
- Increase the percentage of students achieving results in the U2Bs for Numeracy in Year 3 to 45% and Year 5 to 20%
- Identify and cater for students with learning difficulties
- Provide individualised support for students who are achieving results below the National Minimum Standard.

Our initiatives include

- Providing targeted intervention programs in literacy and numeracy for students at risk of not meeting national minimum standards
- Improving teacher capability through focused coaching and professional development to improve student performance
- Providing extension opportunities for U2B students in Reading, Writing and Numeracy
- Continuing to offer an intense reading program supported by teacher aide time and linked to writing program
- Continuing to facilitate Professional Learning Communities (PLC) that build data literacy of teachers and analyse student performance to identify areas of support for students

Providing targeted coaching for teachers to improve pedagogy	\$ 39 500
Providing professional development to staff in order to increase knowledge of the teaching of writing and numeracy (including release for PLCs and curriculum planning) through coaching and release time	\$ 50 000
Purchasing resources to support effective Literacy and Numeracy programs	\$15 950
