Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to school for what will be a busy and fun filled final term of the year.

Term 4 is an exciting transition time at Elimbah SS as we continue the process of welcoming our 2026 Prep students via our 'Step into Prep' program and facilitate opportunities for our Year 6 students to experience secondary school life. For those families who have a child who will be prep age in 2026, I encourage you to pick up an enrolment form from the school office. Should your child be heading off to high school next year, now is the time to contact your chosen secondary school to ensure you and your child have the advantage of accessing all available transition processes.

Uniform reminders

One of the ways in which we retain high standards is by ensuring all of our children wear our school uniform at all times. Last term, we saw a number of non-uniform items begin to creep into the school and therefore I share the following reminders for all families regarding our uniform policy:

Socks - Neutral coloured plain socks

Shoes - Shoes should be predominantly neutral in colour (white, black or brown) and have only minimal other colours on them. Sandshoe style shoes or black leather school shoes are appropriate. All boots including Hightop boots or boots with heels are not acceptable.

Hair - Shaved / clipped patterns (tracks) in hair and mohawks are not appropriate for school. Coloured or dyed hair should be of natural colour. Hair styles should be neat and conservative.

Jewellery - Students may wear a watch and small sleeper or stud earrings. A medical bracelet or medical necklace is also acceptable. Make-up and fingernail polish are not permitted. Religious or cultural medallions on a small necklace/chain are acceptable if they are tucked inside the school shirt.

Mobile phones and smart watches

All families are reminded that mobile phones of all types (including smart watches) require a mobile phone contract and are to be checked into the school office of a morning and collected of an afternoon. Mobile phone contracts are available from the school office.

Of course, one of the most important parts of PBL is recognising and celebrating the great choices our students make every day. Our 'bus tickets' are a fun way of

acknowledging **safe**, **respectful learners**. Students love saving up their tickets and then deciding how to spend them through **Elimbah Station**, an **Acknowledgement System** they co- create with their teachers. It's always wonderful to hear them proudly share what they've chosen—or what big reward they're saving towards!





We're so excited for the term ahead and grateful, as always, for the strong partnership we share with our families. Together, we are building a positive, supportive learning environment where every child can shine.

Transitions:

It's that exciting time of the year when our students begin preparing for their next chapter of learning.

Our Prep students will soon start their transition into Year 1 classrooms. During our *Step Into Prep* days, the Prep cohort will spend time with a Year 1 teacher, helping them become familiar with their new learning spaces and ensuring they feel confident and comfortable as they step into the next stage of their schooling journey. These days also provide wonderful opportunities for students to build relationships, develop independence, and see themselves as part of the "big school."

We are equally excited to welcome our incoming Pre-Prep students and their families to our *Step Into Prep* days. Curriculum Corner

Welcome to a new term of learning! We are excited to share with you the teaching and learning focus areas for English and Mathematics, along with ways you can support your child at home. When school and home work together, we create the strongest foundation for student success.

English Focus: Imaginative Texts

This term, students from Prep to Year 6 will be exploring imaginative (narrative) texts. They will be reading, viewing, and discussing a variety of stories, learning how authors create characters, settings, and events that capture our imagination. Students will then apply these skills to create their own written imaginative text, using creativity to craft beginning, middle, and end structures.

At home, you can support your child by:

- Reading picture books, novels, or short stories together and talking about favourite parts.
- Asking questions like "What do you think this character might do next?" or "How would you change the ending?"
- Encouraging your child to write their own stories, perhaps based on family adventures, pets, or even a made-up superhero.

Mathematics Focus: Number, Algebra and Probability

Across Prep to Year 6, students will be strengthening their understanding of Number and Algebra, building skills in recognising patterns, solving equations, and making connections between numbers and real-life situations.

In Years 3 to 6, students will also be introduced to Probability, exploring chance and likelihood. They will use language such as certain, likely, unlikely, and impossible to describe everyday events.

You might like to try these fun activities at home:

- Play card or board games that involve counting, adding, or strategy.
- Flip a coin or roll dice and discuss the chances of different outcomes.
- Spot patterns together in everyday life, like the arrangement of tiles or the sequence of numbers on letterboxes.

Supporting Learning in all areas, at Home – Lynn Sharratt's 5 Questions

A helpful way to connect with your child's learning is by asking these five simple questions:

- 1. What are you learning?
- 2. How are you doing?
- 3. How do you know?
- 4. How can you improve?
- 5. Where do you go for help?

Asking these questions regularly at the dinner table, in the car, or before bedtime encourages children to reflect on their learning and builds confidence in sharing their progress.

Comprehension Strategy Focus

Strong readers don't just decode words—they make meaning from text. This term, each fortnight we will focus on a key comprehension strategy:

- Weeks 1–2: Self-Monitoring noticing when something doesn't make sense and rereading to clarify.
- Weeks 3–4: Questioning asking "who, what, when, where, why, how" while reading.
- Weeks 5–6: Inferring using clues in the text to "read between the lines."
- Weeks 7–8: Summarising identifying the most important ideas in a text.
- Weeks 9–10: Synthesising combining ideas from different parts of the text (and even from different texts) to build new understanding.

Parents can support these strategies by reading alongside your child and gently modelling the process. For example, pause and say, "Hmm, that didn't make



sense—I'll re-read it" (self-monitoring), or "Why do you think the character did that?" (questioning).

Science Word Puzzle: "I'm Thinking Of..."

This is like a guessing game, but with a science twist. Parents and children take turns being the "Scientist." **How to play:**

- 1. The Scientist secretly chooses a sciencerelated word (e.g., planet, magnet, seed, rain, skeleton, atom).
- 2. They give one clue at a time, starting broad and becoming more specific. For example:
 - "I'm something you can find in the sky."
 - "I shine during the day."
 - "Plants need me to grow." (Answer: the Sun).
- 3. The other player guesses after each clue.
- 4. Swap roles and keep score, or just enjoy the back-and-forth.

Why it's great:

- Builds science vocabulary in a playful way.
- Encourages children to ask good yes/no or what if questions.
- Can be made easier for younger children (animal, water, tree) or trickier for older ones (gravity, evaporation, nucleus).

For a twist: You can hide the written word on a sticky note and put it on their child's forehead—then the child asks yes/no questions to figure it out ("Am I living?" "Do I move?"). This version gets lots of giggles!

Parent Tips for Play

- Start with easier, everyday words if your child is new to the game.
- For older children, pick a harder, abstract word and see if they can "think like a scientist" to guess it.
- Encourage children to ask questions as they guess, like:
 - "Am I living or non-living?"
 - o "Can you see me every day?"
 - o "Am I smaller than a hand?"

This way, the game becomes not just about vocabulary—but about practicing scientific thinking.




